Living Worship, Growing Disciples & Seeking Justice

AFTER a year of visiting places, meeting people, listening to stories and sharing experiences across churches and communities, Bishop Paul explains: “I have been seeking to discern what God is already doing amongst us, recognising it and encouraging us all to join in. I

believe this is our vision from God together, our God given strategy. It grows too from engaging with scripture, particularly passages from Isaiah (56-66). I hope this will provide a stimulus for planning and action to enable us to see God doing even greater things among us that will be transformational for us and those among whom we live and work.”

Living worship

Giving God the glory and honour in our life together and out in the world

Hallmarks of Living Worship will include:

Vibrant - God’s presence is evident
Authentic - genuine, honest and open to God



Faithful - to our global Anglican doctrine, heritage and tradition
Creative - being thoughtful and open to new ways
Whole Life - offering all of our lives as an act of worship
Word & Sacrament - the Bible and sacraments of Baptism and the Eucharist



Generous - with our time, gifts, abilities and money.

Growing Disciples

Seeing more people become followers of Jesus and seeing Jesus’ followers more humbly confident in their faith

Ways of Growing Disciples will include:

Sharing Good News - living and telling the story of Jesus



Worship - as part of our lives

Prayer - discovering the power of prayer in Jesus’ name

Apostles’ Teaching - Reading and studying the Bible to help it change our lives

Fellowship - building communities that know, encourage and support each other



Work - living out our faith in the workplace as whole-life disciples

World - understanding how we are part of God’s worldwide family to learn from this and be encouraged

Seeking justice

Working for a fairer world for everyone both locally and globally, marked by God’s justice

Routes for Seeking Justice includes:

Education - continuing our commitment to education and finding new ways to enhance our work in schools, colleges and institutions

Health - supporting healthcare workers and finding ways to help stop health inequalities

Housing - working with voluntary and state partners to bring about practical improvements

Hospitality - welcoming strangers and all those on the edge with open arms
Work - working for fair employment and equal opportunities for a living wage



Freedom from Oppression - seeking truth and equality in criminal and civil justice systems, including global justice

Peace - building wholesome communities of harmony and security
Creation Integrity - working for wholeness in the natural world and tackling issues like climate change
