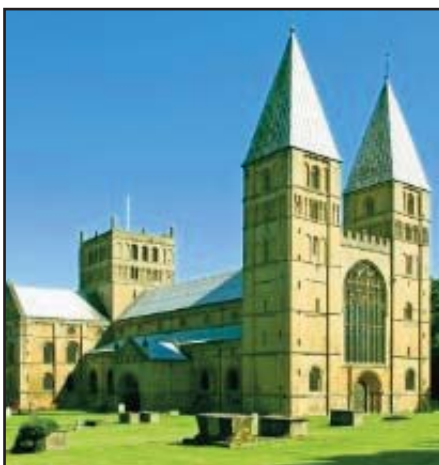
Tour the Archbishop's Palace, Minster and Education Garden

There will be free guided tours of the Archbishop's Palace, Minster and Education Garden on Saturday 15th October.

Tower tours last an hour, starting on the hour, and are £3.50 per person. (Not suitable for children under 7 years of age.)

Tours will last approximately 30 minutes and will take place on the hour and half hour. Turn up and make yourself known at the Information Desk.

The Archbishop's Palace was built in the 1360s and altered in



the 1500s. It retains its original proportions with the beams of the magnificent vaulted ceiling of the State Chamber being mostly medieval originals. The most famous occupant was the all-powerful Cardinal Wolsey.

The Trust gives priority to former clergy, their widows or widowers and Church workers of long standing (10 years) within the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham. In the event of the Trust being unable to identify tenants who meet these priorities, the Trustees have discretion to let to other suitable persons within the parish of the Cathedral Parish Church of St Mary the Virgin in Southwell.

The rent is £500 per calendar month and the Trust can provide assistance in making a claim for housing benefit. In certain circumstances further discretionary relief may be available.

Growing disciples at the Big E Day

The Big E day, the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham annual training day for those involved in children and youth ministry, is all about growing disciples this year. Taking place on Saturday 8th October at Southwell Minster School, the day will bring delegates together for worship, resourcing, and training to support their ministry. The choice of nearly 30 different workshop titles has something for everyone as the day focuses on growing disciples through youth, children and family work. We will be growing younger with input on working with young children, developing faith, and under 5's ministry. We will look at growing deeper through youth and children's resources and initiatives to help establish and deepen faith in the young. And we will be growing wider, considering evangelism and mission through schools, special events, holiday clubs and all-age worship. All this, along with practical sessions on materials to use, puppets, craft ideas, starting out in children's work, developing teams, and plenty more makes this a day not to be missed. People from all Christian churches are welcome to join in with us as we seek to grow disciples together.



Nick Harding, Children's Ministry Adviser, said 'We are already excited about this special day, and the privilege of working with 200 delegates from a huge range of churches. We want to see the church growing disciples who are young, committed, and who can share the Gospel themselves, and this day will support all the great work that takes place week-in, week-out with families, young people and children around Nottinghamshire and beyond.'

This year Big E Day does not clash with half term holidays and is a slightly shorter day (9.30-2.45), so please encourage as many people as possible to come from your church and churches around you – we look forward to welcoming you!

A new Archbishop in the Anglican Province of Burundi

Rosemary Cottingham from St Mark's Woodthorpe attended the inauguration service. She writes:

The Installation of the Most Revd Martin Blaise Nyaboho took place on Sunday 21st August 2016 in Holy Trinity Cathedral, Bujumbura. The service included the necessary formalities of an installation along with a sense of real celebration. Choirs expressed joy and thanksgiving to God for his faithfulness. The Agasimbo dancers from Archbishop Martin's diocese of Makamba delighted everyone with their dexterity and exuberance. Congratulations were received from the Archbishop of Canterbury and many other friends and partners including our own Bishop. Representatives from the Government praised the Church for its contribution to the development of the country over many years and promised to support the Church in its mission in the future.

In his sermon, the Rt Revd Paul Butler, Bishop of Durham, shared insights into the ministry of Jeremiah. He encouraged Archbishop Martin as he works to extend God's Kingdom through personal, community and national restoration and transformation to remember that the God who

called him has promised to be with him always. Bishop Paul challenged the whole church to be faithful to God's call and to pray and work so that all people find a welcome in God's Kingdom.

The General Secretary of the Anglican Communion noted that Archbishop Martin is taking up office at a tough time in Burundi and also within the Anglican Communion. Referring to the Church as beautiful, but fragile, he presented Archbishop Martin with a glass jug. "Don't break the Church" he said, "but keep the focus and unity of the Province".

Looking to the future, Archbishop Martin said the Church would go ahead with preaching the Gospel, teaching and baptising, fighting injustice, working for love and protecting the environment so that all people can live as free human beings. He expressed his gratitude



to the Anglican Communion and to the Archbishop of Canterbury for the support received. He clearly stated that the Province of the Anglican Church of Burundi is, and would always be, a full part of the Anglican Communion.

Archbishop Martin is the fourth Archbishop of the Province of the Anglican Church of Burundi and succeeds the Most Revd. Bernard Ntahoturi who has been Primate for eleven years. Deep appreciation and thanks were expressed by Archbishop Martin and others for Archbishop Bernard's hard work, exemplary leadership, and productive ministry. Archbishop Bernard congratulated his successor and prayed that God would bless his ministry.
