



THE INTERNSHIP
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The vision for the internship is to raise up followers of Jesus who are confident in who God is and who He has made them to be. The internship puts discipleship to Jesus as the number one priority, as we believe everything flows from that.

The internship is an exciting opportunity for 18 to 30-year-olds to invest in their discipleship and leadership by **serving in a local church** between September and July each year.

You will be a part of a dynamic cohort of other interns, students and young adults who are committing to the same journey of learning what it means to live everyday with Jesus, become like Him and seek his purposes in our churches and beyond.

The teaching programme for the internship is integrated into The Apprentice Track programme – a 10 month journey that exists to help participants go deeper in their relationship with Jesus. Interns will also receive extra theological and ministry training, as well as the opportunity to spend time in different contexts within the Church of England throughout the year.

The internship is an amazing opportunity to grow in leadership, get to know your gifts, and develop your sense of calling. This all happens in the context of serving in a local church, where you get to put into practice all that you are learning. This could be in any area of ministry, e.g. children's or youth work, worship, prayer, media & communications, community engagement, and more. You'll be a part of a church staff team that will invest in you and support you throughout the year.





Practicalities

The internship programme runs from the start of September to the end of July. With support from your placement church, the Southwell & Nottingham diocese, and the national Ministry Experience Scheme, we are able to offer living expenses of £85 a week. There is (limited) housing spaces in diocesan accommodation for those participating in the programme (at no extra cost). Our vision is for these to be houses of prayer, hospitality and community as apprentices of Jesus journeying together. Living in a diocesan housing is not compulsory and it is also possible to fully participate in the programme having made alternative arrangements for where you will live.

WHO'S IT FOR?

The internship is for anyone aged between 18 and 30; whether you've just graduated from university or college, just finished school, or are simply looking to invest a year in this way – the internship is for you. You don't need to have a certain amount of experience or have any special qualifications – this is for anyone who is passionate about Jesus and open to learning more and stepping into what He has for them.

HOW MANY HOURS A WEEK IS IT?

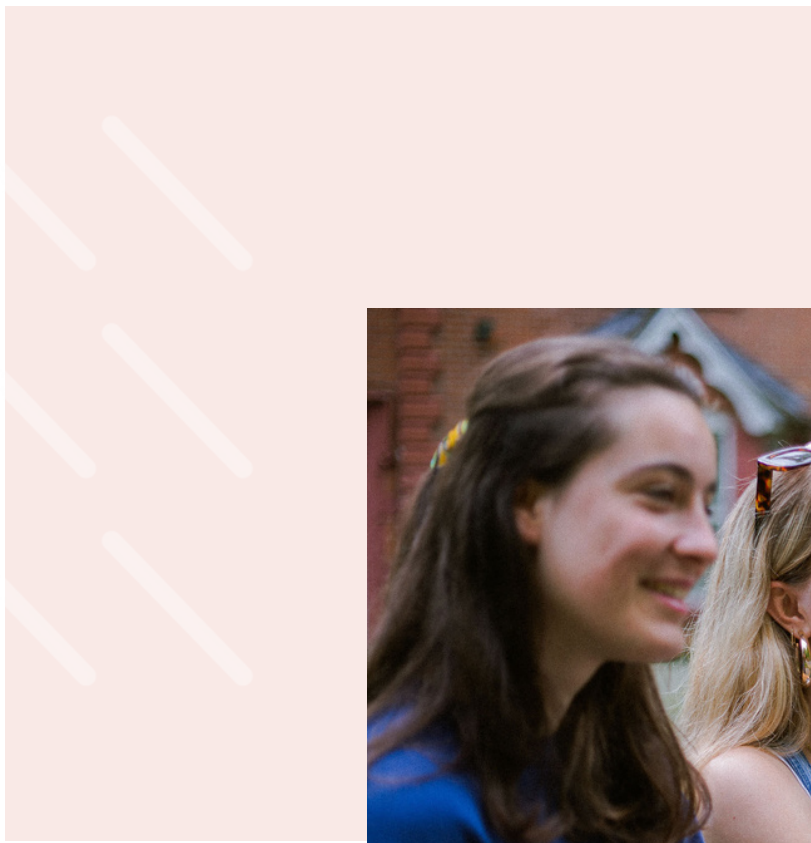
The internship is the equivalent of full-time hours (37.5 per week). Your time with The Apprentice Track and other training is incorporated into these hours.
