Welcome!



The Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham incorporates the City of Nottingham, the whole County of Nottinghamshire and five parishes in South Yorkshire. The population is 1.15 million – 51% live in the greater Nottingham conurbation, 31% in ex-mining areas and 18% in rural. There are 305 churches (252 parishes), served by 142 stipendiary clergy and licensed lay workers.

In 2024 we launched our refreshed vision of **Living Hope for the city, towns and villages in Nottinghamshire and beyond.** We believe the presence of thriving, growing churches across the diocese is vital for people to discover Living Hope and make the best decision anyone could ever make for their lives – to become a disciple of Jesus Christ. To enable this vision, we are committed to our mission of **Growing disciples of Christ** with **compassion**, **confidence** and **courage**. To support both parishes and the diocese in this we have identified 7 areas of focus: inspiring worship, reaching younger, enhancing diversity, growing leaders, enabling commitment, encouraging generosity and nurturing prayer. It is my hope that each worshipping community in the diocese will develop a compelling picture of its own future in God's purposes with an expectation of growing numerically and in the scope of its mission. All Saints Centre

Our church hall was rebuilt into this fantastic centre that has excellent facilities. The café is exclusively for the church (hired for other events with the permission of the incumbent) and the centre is closed to enable church use on Sundays and holy days. The centre has a large main hall, 3 seminar rooms, the school nursery, 2 consultation rooms and a



classroom. The centre is run by the trustees and the post holder would be expected to take on a role of trustee. We operate many community activities from the centre, and it attracts many nonchurch goers from the parish for the various classes and events held there, the centre is an opportunity for growth and outreach for the church.

All Saints School

Our fabulous church infant school is located across the main road and strong links exist between Church and School. The majority of governors are members of the church and as such are involved in all areas of school life, particularly working together with the school to ensure that the strong Christian ethos is maintained. The post holder is required to be a school governor. The school regularly hold worship in church and often



take part in our larger services including Remembrance Sunday and Christingle. The recent SIAMS inspection judged the school to be outstanding.

Our Ministries



Life groups – We have 4 life groups that meet weekly (term time) for bible study, prayer and pastoral care. The groups choose their own literature currently and tend to follow the main church seasons.



Men's – Monthly breakfast in the Church café with prayer time. This includes nonchurch goers. Some of the men also attend the annual CVM 'Gathering'.



Women's – Sporadic events throughout the year that include film afternoons/nights, spirit soaking, tea, and theatre trips. A good amount of women from the church attend the annual womens conference in Leicester called 'Jewel'.



Overflow – a worshipping community that meets fortnightly. Launched to compliment the Sunday services and offer a time of worship and prayer ministry. Once a month this is held in other local churches which has helped to strengthen our relationships across the local churches.



Little Stars – weekly baby & toddler group (term time) held in the All Saints' Centre on a Thursday morning. Well attended and very well structured with planned activities, food and fellowship each week.

Social – We are a church that oozes hospitality. We run social events throughout the year, craft family fun and food days, we have two church fairs every year, we have craft groups, welcome space and food for most occasions!

Charities – We support several charities as a church including Tearfund, Christian Aid, the Childrens Society, Open Doors, Embrace, Mission in Winterveld & we support the Archbishop of Jerusalem as well as supporting the local food bank through food donations.

Social Media - we have a Facebook account, and we live stream our morning service most weeks.



Safeguarding

All Saints church has a strong commitment to safeguarding and providing a safe worshipping environment for all. There is a clear chain for reporting concerns, and these are handled sensitively and in a timely manner ensuring that the referee and referer are supported. The PSO has strong links with the Diocese and calls on their experience, knowledge and support when appropriate.

Communication about safeguarding with the PCC is excellent and all members accept their responsibility by completing safeguarding training and promoting a safe environment. Safeguarding at All Saints Church is more than a bureaucratic tick box exercise, we live out God's commandment to love one another.

Our worship life

Sunday Services 10am – 1st of the Month is All Age; 2nd & 3rd are Communion and 4th Sunday is Service of the word. Each led with contemporary worship by our worship team which offers a plethora of musical talents including vocals, drums, guitar, bass guitar, keyboards/piano, flute and trumpet. Average attendance is 56 adults and 8 children.

Evening Service is on 1st Sunday of the month at 6pm with Holy Communion and more traditional Anglican service and worship led by a pianist. Average attendance is 12 adults.

Our Village

Huthwaite is a village situated on the North Nottinghamshire border, close to Derby and the Peak District; an ex-mining village located in the Ashfield district; 2 miles from Sutton town and 5 miles West of Mansfield. Huthwaite is surrounded by green spaces and is well equipped with local amenities including shops, healthcare facilities, leisure activities, a library, 2 nurseries, one infant school and one infant & junior school and there are 4 secondary schools within a short commute. We have 3 parks, one with a café that was built on ex-mining land, a golf course, tennis and boules courts, boxing club, scouts, rainbows and brownies and the Huthwaite Hub offers craft opportunities for people. From the All-Saints' Centre we also have regular dance sessions, a musical theatre group, sports therapy, craft groups, baby & toddler group, martial arts and more.

Huthwaite has a population of circa 6,351 and is a growing diverse community that is becoming more multi-cultural as we move further away from our mining history. The community support our church events and community engagement including fun days, the monthly car boot, Christmas tree lighting and Remembrance parade.

We have two other churches, the Greek Orthodox and the Methodist church, who run a food pantry.

We have a plethora of fast-food options and two very good Indian restaurants and to balance that we have a lovely local farm greengrocer.



Our Church

Our church building was crafted from stone gifted by the New Hucknall Colliery which was hauled up Common Road by horse and cart, taken from the deep hard seam 400 yards below the surface and is an unlisted building. All Saints is one of the only churches believed to be built from stone from below the surface. Growth in spirituality, a deep and vibrant living faith, through our different styles of worship is our priority, ahead of growth in numbers.

We have a fully flexible space with chairs and a projector and sound system. We have a wonderful baptistry underneath our Chancel in the shape of a cross. Our quinquennial is up to date.





Finances

We have a strong finance team who manage our accounts well every year, our parish share for 2023 was £45,912.00. We have maintained a good financial position during 2023 and have paid our full parish share and covered all costs with our reserves beginning to return to a good level.

Giving is mostly now done through online banking, though we do have giving envelopes and an online donation facility. We have an annual 'gift day' in October to encourage a review of giving for all.
